Cook with Me Crockpot Applesauce

- 12 apples
- ½ cup water
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 tbsp lemon juice
- ½ tsp cinnamon

Peel and core apples, cut into quarters, and put into crockpot. Coat apples in lemon juice and then stir in sugar and cinnamon. Add water and cook on high for 3-4 hours until apples are soft. Mash into applesauce.



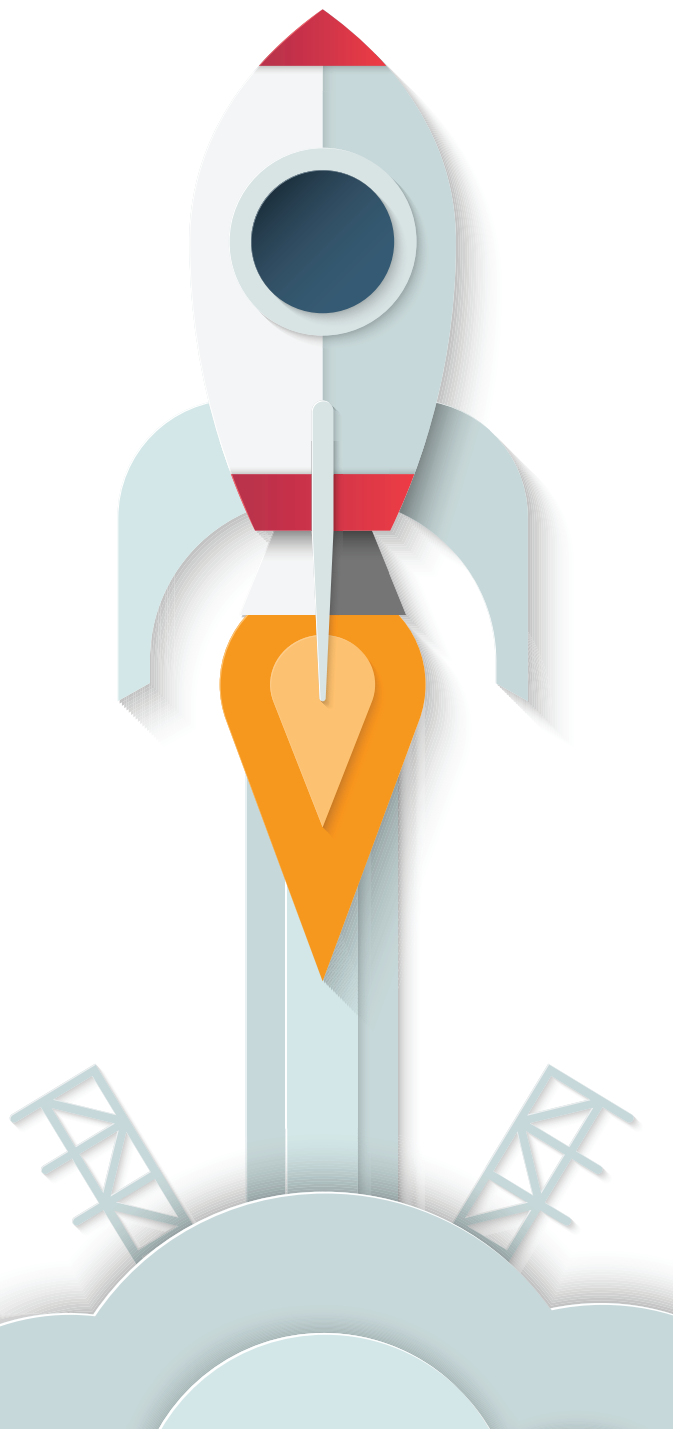
Create with Me Name Rockets

Cut out 2" squares of different colors of paper. Give each child enough for each letter of their name. Have children write a letter of their name in each square and then glue the letters in order on a vertical line on construction paper. Next, cut a triangle with a 2" base and glue to the top of the name. Add marker or even glitter glue after the last letter to show flames coming from their name rockets. Children can finish off their art with star stickers around the rocket.



Play with Me Planet Toss

Label buckets with planet names. Then scatter them within tossing distance from a starting line. Ask the children to stand on the starting line and toss bean bags into the buckets. Make each planet worth a different amount of points.
